



Tell Congress to Protect Medicaid Funding

Congressional leaders are considering several legislative proposals that could result in **significant reductions in Medicaid funding**, including **per-capita caps, reducing the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) floor, and rescinding enhanced funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)**. While these ideas are still in the very early stages and remain undefined, they signal potential risks to critical supports for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

Proposals that reduce federal Medicaid funding threaten community providers and the sustainability of services for people with IDD. Per-capita caps and other similar changes would fundamentally alter Medicaid's structure, shifting costs to states and putting pressure on state budgets in ways that could jeopardize access to essential care.

This is a critical moment to make your voice heard. **Contact your Senators and Representative** today and urge them to reject cuts to federal Medicaid funding. Tell them:

- Per-capita caps and other proposals that would reduce federal funding for Medicaid threaten access to community-based services for individuals with IDD.
- Cuts to federal funding for Medicaid jeopardize the ability of people with disabilities to live independently, find and maintain work, and achieve their goals.

Send a message to your Senators and Representatives to protect Medicaid Funding for people with disabilities!

The proposals under consideration may be **early** and **undefined**, but it's **vital** to let lawmakers know that Medicaid cuts are harmful to people with IDD and our communities. Together, we can safeguard the services that people with IDD and their families depend on.
